Timetable changes between 23rd December and 2nd January 2025.

Services will be running differently over Christmas and New Year. In some cases, last departures will be earlier than usual, or there will be limited or no service on some days. Operators will run a Saturday plus service on 23rd & 24th December and 2nd & 3rd January to support people getting to work.

Park and Ride sites, interchanges and Traveline will also operate reduced hours.

For train services please be aware that engineering works may occur over the Christmas period, visit the National Rail Enquiries website or call them on 03457 48 49 50 to check before you travel.

Sheffield City Council is closed to all but essential services over the Christmas period.

The council's telephone line will be closed from December 23rd, 2024 to January 2nd 2025. However, you can use the council's online services to report, apply, and pay 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The council will reopen on Tuesday, January 2, 2024.

Community Support Helpline

The Helpline is open for **urgent hardship support only** on 24th, 27th, 30th and 31st December between 9am-5pm. The service is closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Years Day. Normal hours resume on the 2nd January. The Helpline can be contacted by telephone on 0114 2734567 – option 0.

<u>Citizens Advice Sheffield</u>: CAS Advice Line and CAS energy affordability line are both operating a skeleton service on Christmas Eve until 4pm. Both services are available 27th, 30th and 31st Dec and then re-open on 2nd January 2025. Energy Affordability Line: 0800 448 0721. Advice Line: 0808 278 7820 – opening hours for both services 10am-4pm.

Bin collections

Residents can place extra recycling and waste next to their bins between December 27th and January 23rd.

If your bin collection day is a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday please be advised that there will be no collections taking place on 25, 26 December 2023 and 1 January 2024. Your collections will change:

<u>Wednesday collections</u> Residents whose normal collection day is Wednesday 25 December, will now have a collection <u>on Saturday 21 December</u>.

Residents whose normal collection day is Wednesday 1 January, will now have a collection on <u>Thursday 2 January</u>.

<u>Thursday collections:</u> Residents whose normal collection day is Thursday 26 December, will now have a collection <u>on Friday 27 December.</u>

Residents whose normal collection day is Thursday 2 January will now have a collection on Friday 3 January.

<u>Friday collections:</u> Residents whose normal collection day is Friday 27 December, will now have a collection on <u>Saturday 28 December</u>.

Residents whose normal collection day is Friday 3 January, will now have a collection on <u>Saturday 4 January</u>.

Please put your bin out for collection before 7am on your collection day, and make sure your bin lid is closed to ensure collection. All other bin collections will take place as normal. View your bin collection calendar.

Extra festive recycling and waste.

Brown bins - Up to two extra bags of tins, cans and plastic bottles will be collected between 27 December and 23 January. Just put your extra recycling in a carrier bag, tie it, and then put it out for collection next to your brown bin. <u>Glass bottles and jars must be placed inside your brown bin</u>, otherwise the extra recycling will not be collected.

<u>Blue bins:</u> Small amounts of extra paper and card will be collected. Bundle it together, tie it, and then put it next to your blue bin. (The bundle should be no bigger than your blue bin).

<u>Black bins</u> Between 27 December and 23 January only, up to two bags of extra nonrecyclable waste will be collected. Put your extra waste into a black bag, tie it, and then put out for collection next to your black bin.

<u>Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs)</u> All sites will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day. They will also close at 3 PM on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Following an email from my colleague Adam Howard at Age UK regarding a meeting of Sheffield Equality Partnership about how to bring different voices "to the table" when considering developments of all kinds in our city.

There seemed to be a general feeling that the current system is not working as well as it could. People were saying it needs re-thinking, joining up, and resourcing better. We feel this is an important issue and that older people find it difficult to have there opinions heard

What do you feel would help move things forward? And what else needs working on?

For reference, one partnership has the following 6 themes:

- Community & Neighbourhood
- Business, employment and "good jobs"
- Crime and Safety
- Health & Wellbeing
- Education & Skills
- Sport & Culture

We know that community engagement is not always an easy. However, I do know that it needs clear purpose, time, resources, clarity and – above all, perhaps – the building of trust.

For example the bus survey for South Yorkshire is not going well, I heard they've had a poor response. I feel one of the main reasons being a <u>26</u> page document to read before you complete it! It really puts people off. It's online only so that doesn't help. As we don't all have access, also not the skills or the inclination. (I never mention surveys in the newsletter unless I have tried them to make sure they work properly!)

The cost of living and uncertainty generally, is worrying so many across the City, not just older people.

The Council has a legal obligation to engage with people with "protected characteristics" – which are:

age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

We would appreciate any comments you may have so we can include them in our discussion at our next meeting on the 9th January.


